Friends of Baseball believes every child should have the opportunity and tools to swing for the fences on the field and in life. Together, with our community partners, Friends of Baseball has provided \$4.1 million in programming, scholarships, grants, and equipment since 2005 and served over 40,000 children. The Full Count RBI after school and summer baseball and softball programs have served over 1,500 youth in 3 counties and 5 school districts, and created employment opportunities for high school students and young adults through a baseball-inspired curriculum that includes physical recreation, academic, and socio-emotional enrichment activities.
